

THE NATIONAL, ONE MANS HISTORY.

The Early days, and subsequent development over the years.

The Rally came about because of the interest, foresight and dedication of Paddy Morrissey, ably assisted by other enthusiasts in the Munster Motorcycle and Car Club. The organising Committee assembled by Paddy included Tom Murphy, Jim Hennessy, Archie Canty, and Reggie Tilson, all active in the Club. There had been a thriving Veteran and Vintage old car movement in Ireland from the late 1930s, and annual events were held in Dublin, Tipperary and Cork. The car runs had gone from strength to strength in the 1950s, and included classes for motor cycles, but there was little enthusiasm for the two wheeled classes, as most owners also had old cars which they preferred to use.

The D & D run in Dublin had for many years catered solely for the old bikes, and was very successful. Paddy Morrissey decided that interest in old motorcycles outside Dublin could be further fostered if there was a specific run held for them. He arranged that there would be a good array of prizes to encourage participation, and attended VMCC events in the UK, canvassing for entries to add to the importance of the event in the hope of encouraging local enthusiasts to bring out their bikes.

The first National was held on 30 September 1967. There were three starting points, Cork, Clonmel and Waterford, with all routes converging at Youghal, with an overnight stop and dinner at the Monatrea House Hotel. There are 54 entries shown in the Programme, including 11 who came by ferry from the UK. In 1968 there were 100 entries, 37 from over the water, so the formula seemed to be successful from the start.

The event was adversely affected by the political troubles from 1974 on, however Paddy scored a great coup by arranging that the Windmill Rally would be run in tandem with the National on two occasions in the late nineteen seventies. This had the great effect of encouraging people from the UK to come back, as well as bringing entries from mainland Europe. Some of the links made at that time still remain to this day, and many international friendships were made and fostered. In later years entrants have travelled from around the Globe, notably Japan, New Zealand, US and Canada, to take part in the Irish Rally, giving the event a real international flavour.

After a few years it became apparent that the riders who travelled from across the water were taking a weeks holiday to do the run, and Paddy thought that he should fill in the week for them by holding a mid week rally. The Munster Rally was thus born, and ultimately developed into a three day run, followed by the National on Saturday. The format has evolved over the years to run from Monday night to Saturday morning, to help overseas entries to complete the run within one working week's holidays.

The Organisers


Paddy's original organising Committee are named above, and remained active for a number of years. Many people have helped over the years, and it must be remembered that all this help and work is voluntary. When referring to organisers and helpers there have been many over the years, and if individuals are omitted I trust that they will forgive me. Of the original helpers, Jim Hennessy was unfortunately taken ill just prior to one year's event, and time was running out for the routes to be prepared. Archie Canty had a lovely daughter Eve, who had recently been married to a motorcyclist who was a Club member. Archie leaned on him and Mick O'Mahony became the Clerk of the Course for the next quarter of a century or more.

Paddy's wife Julia was in charge of the hotel arrangements and meals. She and Paddy developed the famous Morrissey Money, with the clarion call No Ticket No Dinner. Punch Brechinridge did breakdown, ably followed by Paddy Bassett who remains the wizard mender of all time. Noel O'Donovan has looked after this end of the event for a long time now, and let it be noted that at least one long time competitor has vowed that the best day he ever had on the National was the one he spent helping Noel with the recovery. What little of the day he can remember, that is.

Brendan O'Reilly was an early competitor. Most years his bike failed on the first day, and he helped for the rest of the week doing checkpoints. After a few years of this it made sense to leave the bike at home, and Brendan and Bridget have been doing check points ever since. Sean O'Sullivan was in charge of results for many years, handing over to Arthur Mortimer who was also M C for the Prizegiving and Speeches. Chris O'Mahony finally cracked it with the aid of his computer skills, but to no avail for me as I had given up competing years before, when I moved house and threw out a bin full of plastic Angels.

The new generation grew up in the job, Barbara Morrissey helping Paddy and Julia, and Lynda and Avril helping Mick. Joe Dwyer, Chris O'Mahony, and Morgan and John O'Regan were Club members who were always there to help with Scrutiny after Seany Welsh retired, and Paddy Guerin hovered in the background to take up the slack if needed.

Paddy Morrissey's failing health was apparent to us all, but nevertheless his loss came as a shock to us. A lovely man, whose vision, organising skills and hard work

gave so many of us such fun, fellowship and good sport that we are forever in his debt. Mick O'Mahony gave a touching oration at the funeral, and stepped into Paddy's place as Secretary and chief organiser. Morgan took over as Clerk of the Course, aided by the other Club members. Mick was like Paddy, hard working, pleasant, organised and unflappable. His sudden death in 2002, at a young age immediately after his retirement, was a shock to us all, and an appalling loss to his Family.

The current Organising Committee had to take over at short notice, and in a totally unexpected situation. They have accomplished this task brilliantly, and following on from Paddy and Mick, they have developed their own way of managing the Event. They have proved able to continue to run a successful Rally which has grown in popularity and numbers. They have managed to do this by running an event which is organised enough to have a shape, while at the same time giving freedom for individuals to enjoy themselves within reason. This speaks volumes for the vision, hard work and planning of the Committee, and it is interesting to note that these are the same qualities which have brought success right from the beginning of the National.

The Characters

The National is about bikes, roads and friends. About people enjoying themselves, preferably safely. About the Characters. Many are regulars, some do not ride anymore, some are gone, but we have memories of so many good times in 40 years.

Some things are central. Quicky and Tomo were met by Brian Coomber at Rosslare in 1967. Brian's task was to collect their bags, and then drive to Clonmel in front of them, so they would get to the start without getting lost. I understand they stayed behind him for a few miles before getting bored, passing him out and disappearing up the road. The stories are legion, the bikes immortal. DLO 865 and TG 2888. Richard who knows more about life than many of us will ever know. Tomo falling off into the ditch on the top of the Conor Pass and needing Physio in Tralee. Is that you.....

Ron Cresswell was team leader for years, helping us to grow up, have good clean fun with a discarded WC, and showing us how a sidecar should be handled. George Kingston on his first Munster, on Bassett's Ariel with bald sidecar tyres in the wet. For the first few days they thought he was lucky, by the end of the week they knew he was good. Don Stringer with his Enfield hard to beat, then on the Veteran teaching us always to start decelerating before the top of the Healy Pass if you have no brakes. Geoff Peeling, who had the best selection of Rugby songs in all Maghull. Jan Barton, a beautiful rider, 7 punctures in the week on the M20, sadly gone, but we still remember the
